## What does instruction look like?

- Teachers will simulcast
- Simulcast means virtual and in person instruction simultaneously
- The instructional block will be structured to meet the needs of both virtual and on campus students.
- 6th 8th Grade students will complete and submit assignments virtually in most cases.

#### **Dismissal**

#### Pick up by car in the front:


- Parents have decals for student pick up
- Teachers walk classes to designated spaces (same as morning spaces).
- Use of radios to communicate which parents are here for pick-up and teacher dismisses student to walk to sidewalk
- Older siblings need to wait with younger siblings

#### <u>6-8th:</u>

- Teachers will walk the students out to the parking lot to get picked up by the parent/guardian
- Walkers:
  - Teacher dismisses to leave campus at designated gate
- YMCA:
  - YMCA staff will walk students to YMCA
- Learning Center:
  - Student dismissed by teacher to walk to cafeteria to enter by playground



- Students will not have to wear school uniform
- Students will need to adhere to appropriate dress and grooming to contribute to a productive learning environment in both in-person and virtual learning environments

#### 1. All students must:



- a. Not come to school if ill including, but not limited to: symptoms of fever (100.4 or higher), cough, sore throat, diarrhea, headache, body ache, shortness of breath, fatigue, loss of appetite and sense of smell, and other flu like symptoms.
- b. Self-screen at home prior to reporting to school.
- c. Comply with all directives related to health and safety, including, but not limited to: usage and passage through common areas and shared spaces.
- d. Abide by social distancing guidelines, keeping a minimum of 6 feet apart where possible.
- e. Follow revised school procedures that may include, but are not limited to: staggered arrivals and dismissal times, after school care or before school care, limited classroom changes, limited movement through the campus, enhanced sanitization, wearing of facial coverings, changes to school cafeteria procedures, increased handwashing, riding the school bus, any school activity outside the regular school day, and other changes needed to comply with state, county and CDC guidelines, and other changes that may be needed for health and safety.
- Avoid congregating when moving throughout campus including when using the bathroom (there is no loitering or congregating in the bathrooms). Students must maintain social distance, as much as possible in hallways. Students are expected to move from one class to another, without stopping anywhere between class periods.
- g. If students are picked up at the end of the day, students will proceed to their car as they are dismissed for the day. Students must continue to wear their mask and social distance.
- h. Not share any school supplies, such as pens, pencils, devices, textbooks, etc.
- Wear face coverings at all times. Facial coverings should cover your nose and your mouth and with state, county and CDC recommendations. All face coverings (whether disposable or reusable) must: be made of 2 or more layers of breathable material; fit snugly, but comfortably against the side of the face and be secured with ties or ear loops allowing the students to remain hands-free. Gaiters with two layers are permitted, or fold it to make two layers. Scarves, ski masks and balaclavas are not substitutes for masks.
  - Exemptions or accommodations (including a plastic shield) to facial coverings must be verified by a treating licensed medical physician as required by ADA, or Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act and agreed to by a compliant 504 Team.
  - Follow district policies for facial coverings when eating, drinking, or for school-related activities (i.e. Band, Chorus, PE) as outlined in District protocols.
- j. Assist with keeping their desks or workstations clean and clutter free.
- k. Abide by separate guidelines for athletics and intramurals as established by District administration.
- Be placed in Virtual Learning if testing positive for COVID-19. Students exposed to COVID-19 shall be assigned to Virtual Learning.

#### 2. Consequences for Student Non-Compliance

a. Any student choosing not to adhere to the District's policy regarding these expectations or any other aspects of this policy may have consequences as outlined in the WUSD Student Behavioral Expectations Handbook and may be assigned to Virtual Learning.



## What are the health and safety expectations?

- Students will receive a health screening upon entering campus.
- We ask that you do NOT send your student to school if they are not feeling well.
- All students and staff must wear a mask at all times while on campus.
- All students and staff will maintain social distancing.

(If you notice a mistake when you receive the notice that your child will be on A or B day, At this point we will only be able to make corrections for siblings, due to it could interfere with the maximum capacity in each room.

#### Food Services Return to School

The WUSD Food Services Department is committed to providing our families with opportunities to pick up nutritious meals of lunch and breakfast through a walk-up or drive-thru meal service option.

Meals will be available daily to all students.

- TK-5 Hybrid Students will have access to meals as they leave the school site.
  - If the student is a bus rider, they will get the meal as they get off the bus.
  - If the student is a walker or is picked-up, they can take a meal as they exit the school campus.
- 6-8 Students and Virtual students can pick up a meal from 10am to 11:00 am and eat (off-site) before school starts.
- 6-8 Hybrid Students (who did not receive a meal) will have another opportunity to a meal as they exit the school campus.
- Virtual students or Parents can pick up their meals (drive-thru or walk-up) Monday & Fridays from 10:00 to 11:00, and Wednesdays from 10:30am to 12:30pm.


# How will the school handle a COVID situation?

- Students experiencing symptoms or testing over 100.4 will be escorted to the space outside of Principal's office to be screened by Health Clerk. Then she will escort them to the Isolation Room inside the office to wait on their family member to pick them up if needed.
- Nurse and Health Clerk will be the primary supervisors of the Isolation Room.
- Max capacity of students in the Isolation room will be four.
- Once in the Isolation room students will be required to remain seated at a designated location with masks on at all times for the duration of stay.
- Daily sanitation of the Isolation room on the days any students are housed there.




Yard Staff have been assigned areas to supervise bathrooms throughout the day.

#### **Restroom Procedures:**

- Send only one student from the classroom at a time.
- There will be dots outside the restroom area for students to wait on, if there are no stalls available to use.
- Custodial will maintain and sanitize the restrooms on a regular schedule




- Students will be under solar panels for TK (Mrs.Wong), 3rd, 5th, 6th-8th




